Topic

Sight Words

The first 100 sight words make up half of the text that your child reads. Knowing their sight words is very important! Spend some time practicing!

Phonological Awareness

Your child can work on the sounds in words. This is a very important skill in the development of your child's reading skills.

Suggested Activities

Sight Word Practice



Practice the words you don't know by...

- Robot Read
- Sing spell (sing the letters and then sing the word)
- Whisper read...shhh!
- Playdough Fun: make your words with playdough and then say them.
- Guess the word: have a family member write the word on your back with their fingers and guess the word
- Fidget Spinner Challenge. See if you can read an entire list before the fidget spinner stops.

Family Fun:

- It's rhyme time! Say a word, and have your child try and come up with a rhyming word. The rhyming word can be real or silly!
 - Bubble: (stubble, wubble)
- Name Game: Have fun with the names of people in your family. Have your child replace the first letter in a name with a different sound.
 - Say, "what would "mom" sound like if it started with "f?"
- Change the last sound of a word.
 - Say, "what would "hot" be if I changed the "t" sound to "g."

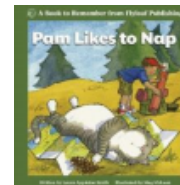
Bellevue Public Library:
